RECIPE

Sweet Potato Ice Cream Pie

Crust:

1 1/4 C. graham cracker crumbs 3 tbsp. sugar 1/3 C. butter or margarine, melted. Combine crumbs and sugar; stir in butter, mixing well. Press mixture firmly into a 9" pie plate.



Bake @350 degrees for 8 minutes. Cool before filling with the following:

1C. cooked, mashed sweet potatoes

1 qt. vanilla ice cream, softened 1/2 C. firmly packed brown sugar 1 prepared graham cracker crust 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon Whipped cream 1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg Chopped pecans

Combine potatoes, brown sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg in large mixing bowl stirring until sugar dissolves. Add ice cream; mix thoroughly

Spoon into graham cracker crust; freeze 8 hours. Garnish with whipped cream and chopped pecans. Let stand at room temperature 5 minutes before serving.

GOLDEN HISTORY

In 1890 Golden's population had increased from fifty to one hundred. At this time, Golden supported two saw mills, a shingle mill, cotton gin, three churches, and a school. Originally, the school south of Golden was named the Friendship school, but it later moved into town and became the Golden school. Although it was a farming community, the railroad's tie-cutting industry played a very impor-tant role in the economy and prosperity of Golden. In the early to mid 1900's, Golden consisted of the railroad, bank, drugstore, "The Golden Rule" newspaper, pickle factory, dry good/grocery store, shoe shop, hotel, hardware store, school, cotton gin, post office, barber shop, black smith shop, automotive repair shop, gas station, and churches. Many of these businesses disappeared during or shortly after Golden is a small the depression. farming town in East Texas located approximately 80 miles east of Dallas, one mile off U.S. Highway 69 on FM Road 779. Golden's history began in the late 1870's when C. W. Tucker built a saw mill near present-day Golden. When the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railroad built a line from Greenville to Mineola in 1882, Golden was "born" and was named after a railroad construction engineer named John G. Golden. With the arrival of the railroad, Golden began to flourish and be-came a small town. In 1885, the post office was founded and Julius C. Lamberton was appointed postmaster. The area was settled as early as the mid-1860s.

Golden was named after one John Golden, a construction engineer for the

MK&T railroad when it built South from Greenville toward Mineola in 1881. This portion of Wood County supplied railroad ties for the MK&T while the timber lasted. By the mid 1880s, Golden had been granted a post office and by 1890 it had a respectable 100 citizens, several businesses and a vineyard - a fairly rare enterprise for East Texas considering the abundance of wild grapes. By the mid 1890s the population was around 300 and just prior to WWI the town reached its population high-water mark of 650. The town got a bank in 1907 and their newspaper was cleverly named "The Golden Rule."

The Great Depression forced the bank to close in 1931. Golden's population declined further and by the mid-1950s, the railroad had abandoned the Greenville - Mineola tracks. The population has remained between 100 - 200 persons from the late 60s until the present.

Golden Sweet Potato Festival is held during the fourth week in October each year, the Sweet Potato Festival in Golden, Texas had its humble beginning in 1982. Monty Montgomery, a local radio station owner, came up with the idea of a community-wide get together once a year to raise money for the repair and upkeep of the Golden Community Center. The festival began with two events -- a cooking contest and an auction of boxes of sweet potatoes grown by local farmers. Two flat-bed trailers were joined together to form a "makeshift" stage for the sweet potato and food auction.

What began as a "community event" and fund raiser has since become a huge celebration- one of the largest events in Wood County, Texas! It's a time for family and class reunions, but most of all, especially for the farmers, it's a time for celebrating the sweet potato harvest. Today, the festival is an arm extended into the community which distributes charitable funds through-out the area to volunteer fire departments, Meals on Wheels, local scholarships, and the Special Kids' Farm and Ranch Day, just to name a few. If you were to visit the festival, you would still see the sweet potato auction, but you would also see and experience more! Who could have predicted what an important role a variety of sweet potato called the Beauregard would become to a little farming town in Texas!

Every year in the spring, something very special happens in Golden, Texas, and that's Special Kids' Farm and Ranch Day. Golden is about an hour from Dallas, Texas. Currently, children from Rains, Wood, and Van Zandt counties meet at the well-known Golden Sweet Potato Festival Pavilion for a day of horse-back rides, petting zoos, horse painting, wagon rides, stick horse barrel racing, clowns, tractors, mechanical bull, a super band, good food, a cup cake walk, and many other fun events! Special Kids Farm and Ranch Day is an event that everyone remembers. Come join us!


May 21, 1931-May 19, 2016 ~Tribute to a Gracious Lady~





The sweet potato is a tuber or large underground stem of a plant, in the morning glory family. Sweet potatoes are native to Central and South America and grow best in warm climates with little frost, making them ideally suited crops for the American South.

HIGH NUTRITIONAL VALUE

Sweet potatoes are high in calcium, folate, potassium and beta-carotene. Beta-carotene is an antioxidant which converts to Vitamin A in the body: one serving of sweet potatoes can provide you with as much as 700% of the US RDA for Vitamin A. A 7-ounce (1 cup) serving of sweet potatoes contains 65% of the minimum necessary daily amount of Vitamin C. Because they are so nutritionally rich, The Center for Science in the Public Interest rates sweet potatoes as the number one most nutritious vegetable.

Their high potassium content means sweet potatoes can alleviate muscle cramps which are often related to potassium deficiency. During times of stress, the body uses more potassium, so eating sweet potatoes can help protect you from the negative health effects of tension.

In addition, the sweet potato is a very versatile vegetable. It can be cooked like any other potato. It can be fried, stewed or roasted; used in soups or desserts such as pies, breads, cookies, and cakes. It can be baked into casseroles or simply eaten raw with dip or roasted in the oven and used as chips. Sweet potatoes can be the appetizer, the main dish, the vegetable, AND the dessert!

LOW GLYCEMIC INDEX

Sweet potatoes have a low glycemic index. The glycemic index indicates the impact a food substance has on blood sugar levels. A high glycemic index means blood sugar levels can spike. Diabetics and others who monitor their blood sugar levels seek to avoid foods with a high glycemic index or load. Sweet potatoes have a glycemic load of only 17. (By way of comparison, a white potato has an index of 29.)

To gain the maximum health benefits from eating sweet potatoes, avoid discarding their skins – much of their healing potential resides in this portion of the tubers. Also, following the common dieters' fallacy of avoiding all fats reduces your ability to access sweet potatoes' benefits: beta-carotene absorbs more thoroughly into the body when consumed with a small amount of fat. Recent research seems to indicate that steaming or boiling sweet potatoes rather than roasting them helps preserve their low glycemic index.



(Prize Winning Recipe) 1 pkg. Pillsbury Plus Yellow Cake Mix 3 eggs 1/3 C. cooking oil 1/2 C. water 1/3 C. firmly packed brown sugar 2 tsp. cinnamon 2 C. shredded sweet potatoes 1/2 C. raisins 1/2 C. chopped nuts

RECIPE

Glaze:

1 C. powdered sugar 1 1/2 oz. cream cheese, softened 2 tbsp. milk

1 tsp vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour 12 cup fluted tube pan. In large bowl, blend first six ingredients until moistened. Beat 2 minutes at highest speed. Fold in sweet potatoes, raisins, and nuts. Spoon into prepared pan. Bake 40-50 minutes; turn onto serving plate. Cool completely. Blend glaze ingredients in small bowl until smooth. If needed, add a few more drops of milk to make glaze consistency. Spoon over cooled cake.

Golden Yam Rolls

(Prize Winning Recipe)

1 pkg. dry yeast 1/4 C. warm water 1/4 C. butter flavored shortening 1/2 C. milk, scalded 1/4 C. sugar 1 tsp. salt 1/4 to 1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon 3/4 C. cooked, mashed yams 1 egg, beaten 3 to 3 1/2 C. all purpose flour 1/4 C. butter or margarine

Dissolve yeast in warm water. Let stand 5

min. Combine shortening, milk, sugar, salt, nutmeg, and cinnamon in large mixing bowl. Stir until shortening melts.

Add yams, egg, and yeast mixture, mixing well. Gradually stir in enough flour to make a soft dough.


Turn out dough on a floured surface; knead until smooth and elastic. Place in well greased bowl, turning to grease top.

Cover, let rise 1 hour. Punch down. Roll out to 3/4 inch thickness. Cut and place in a greased 13x9x2 pan.

Brush with melted butter, cover and let rise again for 30 minutes.

Bake @ 375 degrees 20 to 25 minutes or until browned.
